



## Quick Guide: Setting up Stereo Hub HT with silverback speakers using SA Cockpit

### 1. Getting started

- a. Download SA Cockpit from the App Store or Google Play. Install all available updates.  
**Important:** Avoid capital letters and special characters in your WiFi password.
- b. Unbox the Stereo Hub HT and charge the remote control for 15–30 minutes using a USB-C cable.
- c. Mount the supplied antenna on the back of the Stereo Hub HT.
- d. **Important:** Do not connect an Ethernet cable to Surround Hub HT yet.
- e. Connect the Stereo Hub HT to power using the supplied power supply and cable:
  - a. Insert the USB-A plug into the power supply.
  - b. Insert the USB-C plug into the port below the antenna on the Hub.
- f. Wait one minute for the Hub to start up.  
**Important:** Only use the supplied power supply.
- g. Ensure Bluetooth is enabled on your phone.

### 2. Pairing the remote control

- a. Press and hold the *pairing* button on the back of the Stereo Hub HT until the WiSA LED flashes rapidly. Then press any button on the remote.
- b. To confirm pairing, press any button on the remote. The WiSA LED on the Hub should flash briefly each time a button is pressed.
- c. The remote and Hub are now paired.
- d. The remote uses radio signals and does not need to be pointed at the Hub.

### 3. Pairing the Stereo Hub HT with the speakers

- a. Connect power to both (or all) speakers and turn them on using the switch on the back. Wait about 5 seconds until at least one LED lights up.
- b. Press the pairing button on each speaker for 3 seconds until the Wireless indicator begins flashing.  
**Important:** Confirm that all speakers are flashing before continuing.
- c. Press the PAIR button on the back of the Stereo Hub HT for one second. The WiSA indicator on the Hub will begin blinking, indicating that the Hub is searching for the speakers.



- d. After approximately 20 seconds, the speakers' Wireless indicators will illuminate steadily, followed shortly by the Stereo Hub HT's WiSA indicator, which will also remain steadily lit. This indicates that the pairing process has been successfully completed.  
If power is disconnected from the Hub or speakers, they will automatically reconnect when powered again.

#### 4. Setting up WiFi

- a. Make sure your phone is connected to the WiFi network you want the Stereo Hub HT to use.
- b. Ensure the Stereo Hub HT is powered on and that the WiFi indicator is flashing rapidly.
- c. Open SA Cockpit and tap the Stereo Hub HT icon (with the gear symbol).
- d. Select "Continue without pairing."
- e. The speakers will play a confirmation sound indicating that the Hub is connected to them.
- f. The Runway operating system's setup will suggest the same WiFi network your phone is using. Enter the password and allow the app to remember it.
- g. Runway will take about 50 seconds to check for updates and complete the connection. The Hub is connected when the front light is steady and the app confirms setup.  
If preferred, you may now connect an Ethernet cable from your router to the Stereo Hub HT.

#### 5. Setting up speaker channels

- a. Both speakers start as "left" by default. You must identify which physical speaker is the "right" channel and assign it accordingly.
- b. Open the app and tap the speaker icons button in the center. A layout appears showing two speakers and a sofa:
  - a. The two left speaker icons are lit white.
  - b. The right speaker icon is grey.
- c. Tap the left speaker icons once. Two speaker symbols will appear.
- d. Press and hold one of the symbols to play a test sound.
- e. Listen to where the sound comes from:
  - a. If the sound comes from the left speaker, return to step 5.c and test the other symbol.
  - b. If the sound comes from the right speaker, you have identified the correct channel.
- f. Once the right speaker is identified, repeat step 5.c so the icons appear again.
- g. Drag the correct right-speaker icon to the right side of the layout so it overlaps the grey right-speaker symbol.
- h. The app will confirm by applying the new system configuration.

#### 6. Optional: Rename your Stereo Hub HT

- a. You can give Stereo Hub HT a new name such as *Living Room* or *Music System*.
- b. Tap the gear icon in SA Cockpit (top right corner).
- c. Select System.
- d. Tap the pencil icon, edit the name, and save.

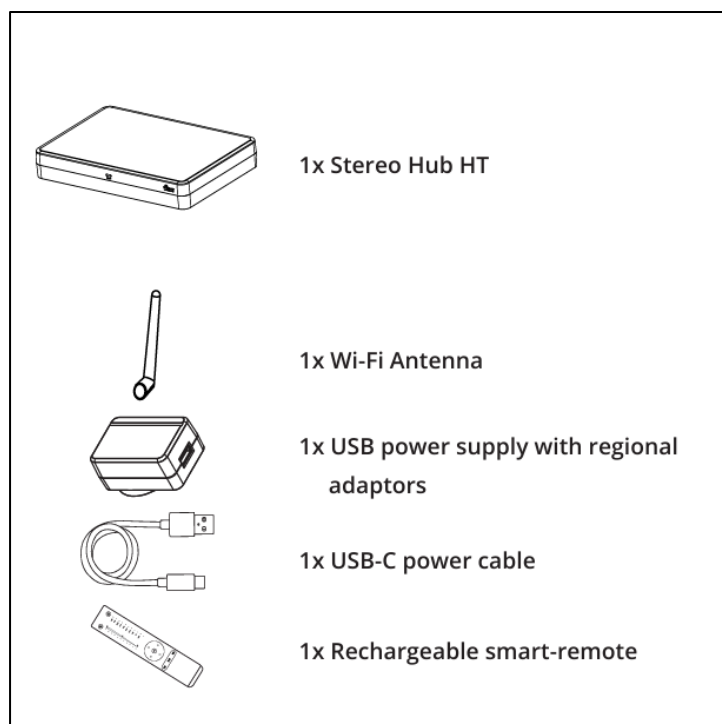
The new name will appear in all streaming apps.

Your music system is now ready to use. You can connect it to devices such as a TV, CD player, or turntable, and you can also stream music from your favourite music services directly from your phone.
